Full Description (including approximate size of the site area if possible)  This WW1 practice trench on the edge of Brocton Camp takes the form of a SE leg approximately 30m long continuing with a 30m NE leg. The narrow trench has a simple zig-zag. Depth varies but is typically 0.6m with spoil thrown up to form a 0.25m mound on the down slope. Vegetation on the disturbed ground shows typical bilberry growth.





